



#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That Committee recommend to Council to continue rental of the cottage.

And further, to spend up to \$10,000.00 on the cottage and switch to Airbnb for rental management.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Council at this time has no plans to rent the cottage out this summer. Last years rent recovery did not cover the operating costs.

There is a plan for updates and improvements that will increase the appeal for renters, but it is dependent on a grant.

Improvements through the grant would not be for the overnight accommodation component. It would not address the cosmetic and health concerns that have previously been discussed at the committee and council level. Basically, the cottage needs sprucing up and some new furnishings.

Also, a system of renting that maximizes the occupancy rate through the short season is needed.

Staff recommends that up to \$10,000.00 be spent immediately on the cottage and that the rentals continue but make a switch to Airbnb. The money would be spent on small improvements and furnishings. Airbnb has a very large web presence that would greatly assist in advertising, as well Airbnb has an efficient administration system.
